- Wagon was 30' long & 6' wide & carried the following:
  - 4 - Big Top Center Poles 48' X 10 1/4" Tapering to 9 1/2" Dia.
  - Long Quarter Poles 34' X 9" Tapering to 5 1/2" Dia.
  - Short Quarter Poles 26' 2" X 9" Tapering to 5 1/2" Dia.
  - Menagerie Center Poles 32' X 7" Dia.
  - General Admission Seat Stringers


This wagon has also been used on the Cole Bros. Circus and has been modified several times. The foot brake was replaced with a brake wheel in 1940, also the top pole rack was removed. Several years later the second top rack was removed. The box and the rack under wagon were also subsequently removed.


Several modifications were made in later years, such as cutting down the top structure to its present condition as seen at the "CIRCUS WORLD MUSEUM. Cole Bros. re-numbered the wagon to 103 sometime in the 40's.






Rear View




**Rear Portion of Frame & Deck Boards**





**Top View of Seat Area**







Looking at the decking of the pole wagon from the front to rear. - Baraboo, 1961 (Conover Collection)





